ANTHROPOLOGY AND FOLKLIFE

HERSKOVITS AT THE HEART OF BLACKNESS

Is there a politics of knowledge? Who controls what knowledge is produced and how it will be used? Is there "objective" scholarship and, if so, how does it become politicized? These questions are examined through this groundbreaking film on the life and career of Melville J. Herskovits (1895-1963), the pioneering American anthropologist of African Studies and one of the most controversial intellectuals of the 20th century. How did this son of Jewish immigrants come to play such a decisive role in the shaping of modern African American and African identities? Herskovits emerges as an iconic figure in on-going debates in the social sciences over the ethics of representation and the right of a people to represent themselves.

This quick-paced, carefully researched documentary traces Herskovits' development as a scholar to the shared African American and Jewish experiences of exile, exclusion and political oppression. Faced with resurgent racism and persistent discrimination in the early 20th century, black and Jewish intellectuals grappled with a common question: could they retain their distinct ethnic identities and still participate as equals in American life? Prominent scholars like Princeton philosopher, K. Anthony Appiah, and Columbia University historian, Mae Ngai, explore this paradox not only in historical and contemporary terms, but through their own experiences as people of color.

The film raises unsettling questions, asking who has the authority to define a culture, especially if people from that culture are denied the opportunity to engage in the scholarly discourse of defining themselves. Vincent Brown provocatively sums up Herskovits as "the Elvis of anthropology," a man who appropriated African culture, but simultaneously mainstreamed its study into the American academe and popular consciousness.

Herskovits at the Heart of Blackness will challenge students to think of "knowledge" as a socio-political construct, shaped by the implicit values and underlying power dynamics of the society in which it is produced. It calls on each viewer to ask "Who controls my cultural identity?" As a result, the film promises to become a core text in Introductory Anthropology, Cultural Anthropology, Sociology of Knowledge, African Studies, African American Studies, and Race Relations classes.

ABA COURSE FOR PARENTS AND THERAPISTS

By: Maximum Potential

Maximum Potential has created 17 different modules that will give any potential instructor the ability to learn everything they need to know about ABA, the set up of an ABA session and how to counteract different challenges associated with ABA. Each set of modules will contain examples from actual ABA therapy sessions.

Volume 1:

Autism Overview

In this module, the most common characteristics of autism will be discussed in detail, including how those characteristics differ from those of typically-developing peers and how they impair a child's ability to learn.

ABA Overview

This module will introduce the broader concepts of ABA as a science and how those relate to treatment packages for children with autism, before more specific applications are detailed in later modules.

Common ABA Approaches

In this module, three specific applications of ABA will be introduced—discrete trial teaching, natural environment teaching (or incidental teaching), and use of task analyses.

Verbal Behavior Analysis

In this module, the analysis of verbal behavior will be explained, as well as the importance of using this type of analysis as a part of language intervention for children with autism.

Volume 2:

Prompting

This module includes specific information and examples related to the following: rationale for using prompts, different types of useful prompts, and prompting hierarchies.

Fading

This module includes the specific strategies for instructions to use prompts while always actively working towards fading those prompts.

Shaping

In this module shaping procedures and examples will be presented in detail, including several that are relevant for many children with autism, such as sitting and responding to instruction, as well as waiting for and/or giving up reinforcement.

Errorless Teaching

Instruction and video examples in this module detail the use of errorless teaching procedures, which are presented in a most-to-least prompting hierarchy (differing from more-commonly used least-to-most prompting hierarchies), and the particular importance of this strategy for children with autism spectrum disorders.

Volume 3:

Reinforcement

In this module, the concept of reinforcement will be introduced, defined, and modeled. Additionally, viewers will learn strategies to assess new and changing reinforcers, as well as procedures to use that reinforcement to affect a range of behaviors (i.e., language, social, cognitive, etc.)

Volume 4:

Discrete Trial Teaching

DTT involves teaching skill components in a very systematic manner, with repeated practice and positive reinforcement. This module provides instruction and examples related to using DTT in combination with other ABA strategies to teach a variety of skills.

Therapy Checklist

In this module, the "Therapy Checklist" will be reviewed in detail, providing instructors with a stepwise and at-a-glance summary of ABA and DTT as applied to teaching children with autism.

Behavior Momentum

The use of behavioral momentum is derived from the idea that it is easier to keep a student participating once he/she has gained momentum (i.e., participated). This module includes the specific procedures and examples needed to understand behavioral momentum in various contexts, and use it to promote participation and a wide variety of skills (during formal teaching situations and incidental teaching opportunities).

Volume 5:

Graphing and Data

The best manner in which we evaluate the effects of any treatment must include measurement. Using graphic representations of these measurements to make decisions about treatment is a critical component to any effective intervention approach. In this module, viewers will learn how to effectively and efficiently track a variety of student performance targets, including behavior reduction targets as well as skill acquisition targets. Also, this module will teach you how to convert raw data to a graphic format, understand and use graphs to make decisions about

programming, and analyze student performance based on graphs.

Volume 6:

Setup

Beginning a program using Applied Behavior Analysis can be intimidating. Where should we do this? Do we need a dedicated room? What materials are necessary? What sort of data should be collected, and which behaviors should be measured? What should we do with the data collected? And, this student does not even comply/attend! What should be done to improve that? These questions will be explained in this module, and examples will be provided to demonstrate key points.

Volume 7:

Behavior Management

Most people with significant language disabilities exhibit interfering behaviors. In many cases, these may include behaviors such as physical aggression, self-injurious behavior, non-compliance/avoidance behaviors, screaming/yelling, and repetitive behaviors such as hand/arm movements or vocalizations/noise-making. The frequency and severity of these behaviors can often be pervasive in that they limit opportunities for learning as well as socialization with peers; in some cases these behaviors can even be dangerous. This module includes the following:

Basic concepts of behavior - how all behavior is cued and maintained
Functions of behavior - identifying outcomes-functions-that reinforce behavior
Intervention design - planning strategies based on functions-relating treatment to function
Positive behavioral intervention - emphasizing consequences for positive behavior

Volume 8:

Natural Environment Training (NET)

NET can essentially be summarized as instruction which takes place outside the context of DTT, often during preferred activities/areas. This module will further outline the integration of NET into a comprehensive treatment package for children with autism, including the use of ABA strategies during NET.

Social Skills

Nearly all children on the autism spectrum have social deficits to some degree. However, given the scope of typical social behaviors, the degree to which those deficits impact different individuals varies widely. In this module, the core components of social skills programming will be detailed.

RTI & DI - THE DYNAMIC DUO

Response to Intervention (RTI) and Differentiated Instruction (DI) are two powerful approaches for addressing the

needs of all learners. They share many common elements, perhaps the most significant of which is their student-centered focus and utilization of on-going assessments to inform decision-making and facilitate good instruction. RTI, as a multi-tiered framework, uses a problem-solving process to match the needs of students to research-based interventions. DI is a way to plan/deliver curriculum and instruction to meet the needs of diverse learners. It is through DI that RTI can be successfully implemented. Indeed, RTI and TI are truly the "dynamic duo!"

This DVD will help you learn how to effectively differentiate instruction in TIER 1 (core curriculum instruction) and TIER 2 (targeted instruction) stages of RTI. There are 492 caves which are arranged over a span of about 1600 meters in a cliff face that stretches north to south.

The total area of wall murals at the complex is more than 45,000 square meters, and there are some 2415 statues. This group of caves called the Mogao Caves, is an example of a type of Buddhist cave-temple referred to as 'One Thousand Buddha Caves' and it is the largest cave-temple complex in the world.

Since ancient times, the Chinese have considered Huangshan to be the most extraordinary mountain in the world. It is situated in the Anhui Province near the lower reaches of the Yangtze River. The bizarre shapes of the peaks of Mount

Huangshan are the result of glacial erosion, and their shapes, along with rare Huangshan pines and 'seas of cloud' combine to create a unique landscape.

They are located in the Pacific Ocean 960 kilometers to the west of Ecuador. They are officially called the 'Archipiélago de Colon.' As they are situated in a location that is isolated from the outside world, the islands are inhabited by many unique plants and animals.

HERSKOVITS AT THE HEART OF BLACKNESS

Is there a politics of knowledge? Who controls what knowledge is produced and

how it will be used? Is there "objective" scholarship and, if so, how does it become politicized? These questions are examined through this groundbreaking film on the life and career of Melville J. Herskovits (1895-1963), the pioneering American anthropologist of African Studies and one of the most controversial intellectuals of the 20th century. How did this son of Jewish immigrants come to play such a decisive role in the shaping of modern African American and African identities? Herskovits emerges as an iconic figure in on-going debates in the social sciences over the ethics of representation and the right of a people to represent themselves.

This quick-paced, carefully researched documentary traces Herskovits' development as a scholar to the shared African American and Jewish experiences of exile, exclusion and political oppression. Faced with resurgent racism and persistent discrimination in the early 20th century, black and Jewish intellectuals grappled with a common question: could they retain their distinct ethnic identities and still participate as equals in American life? Prominent scholars like Princeton philosopher, K. Anthony Appiah, and Columbia University historian, Mae Ngai, explore this paradox not only in historical and contemporary terms, but through their own experiences as people of color.

The film raises unsettling questions, asking who has the authority to define a culture, especially if people from that culture are denied the opportunity to engage in the scholarly discourse of defining themselves. Vincent Brown provocatively sums up Herskovits as "the Elvis of anthropology," a man who appropriated African culture, but simultaneously mainstreamed its study into the American academe and popular consciousness.

Herskovits at the Heart of Blackness will challenge students to think of "knowledge" as a socio-political construct, shaped by the implicit values and underlying power dynamics of the society in which it is produced. It calls on each viewer to ask "Who controls my cultural identity?" As a result, the film promises to become a core text in Introductory Anthropology, Cultural Anthropology, Sociology of Knowledge, African Studies, African American Studies, and Race Relations classes.

Each set of modules will contain examples from actual ABA therapy sessions.

Volume 1:

Autism Overview

In this module, the most common characteristics of autism will be discussed in detail, including how those characteristics differ from those of typically-developing peers and how they impair a child's ability to learn.

ABA Overview

This module will introduce the broader concepts of ABA as a science and how those relate to treatment packages for children with autism, before more specific applications are detailed in later modules.

Common ABA Approaches

In this module, three specific applications of ABA will be introduced—discrete trial teaching, natural environment teaching (or incidental teaching), and use of task analyses.

Verbal Behavior Analysis

In this module, the analysis of verbal behavior will be explained, as well as the importance of using this type of analysis as a part of language intervention for children with autism.

Volume 2:

Prompting

This module includes specific information and examples related to the following: rationale for using prompts, different types of useful prompts, and prompting hierarchies.

Fading

This module includes the specific strategies for instructions to use prompts while always actively working towards fading those prompts.

Shaping

In this module shaping procedures and examples will be presented in detail, including several that are relevant for many children with autism, such as sitting and responding to instruction, as well as waiting for and/or giving up reinforcement.

Errorless Teaching

Instruction and video examples in this module detail the use of errorless teaching procedures, which are presented in a most-to-least prompting hierarchy (differing from more-commonly used least-to-most prompting hierarchies), and the particular importance of this strategy for children with autism spectrum disorders.

Volume 3:

Reinforcement

In this module, the concept of reinforcement will be introduced, defined, and modeled. Additionally, viewers will learn strategies to assess new and changing reinforcers, as well as procedures to use that reinforcement to affect a range of behaviors (i.e., language, social, cognitive, etc.)

Volume 4:

Discrete Trial Teaching

DTT involves teaching skill components in a very systematic manner, with repeated practice and positive reinforcement. This module provides instruction and examples related to using DTT in combination with other ABA strategies to teach a variety of skills.

Therapy Checklist

In this module, the "Therapy Checklist" will be reviewed in detail, providing instructors with a stepwise and at-a-glance summary of ABA and DTT as applied to teaching children with autism.

Behavior Momentum

The use of behavioral momentum is derived from the idea that it is easier to keep a student participating once he/she has gained momentum (i.e., participated). This module includes the specific procedures and examples needed to understand behavioral momentum in various contexts, and use it to promote participation and a wide variety of skills (during formal teaching situations and incidental teaching opportunities).

Volume 5:

Graphing and Data

The best manner in which we evaluate the effects of any treatment must include measurement. Using graphic representations of these measurements to make decisions about treatment is a critical component to any effective intervention approach. In this module, viewers will learn how to effectively and efficiently track a variety of student performance targets, including behavior reduction targets as well as skill acquisition targets. Also, this module will teach you how to convert raw data to a graphic format, understand and use graphs to make decisions about

programming, and analyze student performance based on graphs.

Volume 6:

Setup

Beginning a program using Applied Behavior Analysis can be intimidating. Where should we do this? Do we need a dedicated room? What materials are necessary? What sort of data should be collected, and which behaviors should be measured? What should we do with the data collected? And, this student does not even comply/attend! What should be done to improve that? These questions will be explained in this module, and examples will be provided to demonstrate key points.

Volume 7:

Behavior Management

Most people with significant language disabilities exhibit interfering behaviors. In many cases, these may include behaviors such as physical aggression, self-injurious behavior, non-compliance/avoidance behaviors, screaming/yelling, and repetitive behaviors such as hand/arm movements or vocalizations/noise-making. The frequency and severity of these behaviors can often be pervasive in that they limit opportunities for learning as well as socialization with peers; in some cases these behaviors can even be dangerous. This module includes the following:

Basic concepts of behavior - how all behavior is cued and maintained
Functions of behavior - identifying outcomes-functions-that reinforce behavior
Intervention design - planning strategies based on functions-relating treatment to function
Positive behavioral intervention - emphasizing consequences for positive behavior

Volume 8:

Natural Environment Training (NET)

NET can essentially be summarized as instruction which takes place outside the context of DTT, often during preferred activities/areas. This module will further outline the integration of NET into a comprehensive treatment package for children with autism, including the use of ABA strategies during NET.

Social Skills

Nearly all children on the autism spectrum have social deficits to some degree. However, given the scope of typical social behaviors, the degree to which those deficits impact different individuals varies widely. In this module, the core components of social skills programming will be detailed.
